



Quick Guide to the High Holy Days at Olam Tikvah – 5771

S'lichot, Saturday, September 4,

9:00pm Program: We will view the Coen brother's film, "A Serious Man," followed by discussion and dessert. We'll meet Midwestern physics professor Larry Gopnik, whose staid, stable 1967 life slowly begins to unravel after his wife announces she's leaving him. He seeks the advice of three trusted rabbis, hoping he can learn to cope with his afflictions and become a genuine mensch. Memorial plaques will be dedicated at 11:30pm. The S'lichot Service begins at 12 midnight and lasts one hour.

Service times for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is listed on your tickets included in this mailing. Please have them ready to show as you enter the synagogue. If your personal observance of the holiday excludes carrying, please call the synagogue to place your names on the *Do Not Carry List*, by September 3.

Seating We received many positive comments about our High Holy Day services last year. We also received a few comments offering us some challenges for this year. The most prevalent of these dealt with the saving of seats. We ask that you refrain from this practice so that all of our congregants have the opportunity to be seated on a first-come basis. Tallitot and other personal items left on seats after services will be removed and placed on tables outside the sanctuary or social hall where you may pick them up upon your return to synagogue. Personal items left on seats before Kol Nidre will be placed on tables outside the sanctuary or social hall before the doors are opened.

Service entrances

For the sanctuary service please enter the building through the doors used in previous years and follow the new hallway to the sanctuary.

For the social hall service follow the new path and enter the building through the lower level doors.

Tashlikh will be held on Thursday, September 9, 6:00pm at the home of Tessa & Glenn Fuchs, 3739 Prince William Drive, followed by evening service at Olam Tikvah at 7:00pm.

Children services will be held in the classrooms in our newly completed youth wing. See enclosed flyer for detailed information.
